## **Engaging voters on the International Day of Democracy**

TORONTO, September 13, 2019 – Elections Ontario recognized the International Day of Democracy yesterday with an event at the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, in partnership with the Lieutenant Governor's Office, the Samara Centre for Democracy, and Ryerson's Democratic Engagement Exchange—one of the leaders of the Canadian Vote Coalition.

In celebration of this year's theme for the International Day of Democracy, <u>Participation</u>, Ontario's Chief Electoral Officer Greg Essensa hosted a "Dare to Discuss" event to encourage Ontarians of all ages and abilities to think about democracy as it stands today and to envision new ways of engagement for the future.

The event was followed by a reception hosted by the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, featuring the "Speaking of Democracy" exhibit.
