To request that the information of a deceased person be removed from the registers maintained by Elections Ontario, submit this application by email or mail. You can also complete the online application at [registration.elections.on.ca](https://registration.elections.on.ca).

You will need to submit a copy of documentation showing proof of death. Please refer to the list of accepted documents included in this package.

**Documentation for removing a deceased person from the registers**

To remove a deceased person from the registers maintained by Elections Ontario, you must provide proof of death documentation.

**Examples of accepted documents showing proof of death**

- Burial or death certificate
- Document/receipt issued by a cemetery/crematorium in Ontario that proves burial or cremation
- Life or Group Insurance claim along with a statement signed by a medical doctor
- Medical Certification of Death
- Memorandum of notification of death issued by the Chief of the National Defence Staff
- Notarial copy of Letters of Probate
- Statement of Verification of Death from the Department of Veterans Affairs
- Obituary from a newspaper
- Official notification from the Public Trustee
- Program or notice from a funeral ceremony
- Registration of Death
- Statement from a medical doctor, a coroner or a funeral director
- Any other applicable document from the Government of Canada, a Canadian province or territory, a municipality in Canada, or from its agency proving a person's death
