

## Information for administrators

**Electors without a permanent address can still vote in provincial elections. Here's how you can help!**

Your facility can sign up with Elections Ontario to provide eligible electors without a permanent address with a Certificate of Identity and Residence form, which can be used as a temporary form of ID when they go to vote.

**Which organizations are eligible to participate in this program?**

- Shelters
- Food banks
- Community health care facilities

When a provincial election is called in your electoral district, Elections Ontario will email an Authorization for Administrators form to your facility. If your facility does not receive this form, please contact **outreach@elections.on.ca**.

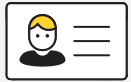

## How to vote without a permanent address

Shelters, food banks and community health care facilities can sign up with Elections Ontario to provide eligible electors without a permanent address with a Certificate of Identity and Residency form when a provincial election is called.



This certificate serves as a temporary form of ID for electors to use when they go to vote.

## Who can vote in a provincial election?

To be eligible to vote in a provincial election, you must be:



18 years of age or older on election day;



a Canadian citizen; and



a resident of Ontario.

## Information for electors

When a provincial election is called in your electoral district, follow these steps to receive a Certificate of Identity and Residence form:

- 1 Determine the facility you have returned most often to eat or sleep in the past five weeks.



- 2 Ask the facility for a Certificate of Identity and Residence form. If they aren't registered for this program, let them know that they can contact Elections Ontario to sign up.



- 3 Use the facility address to look up your electoral district and voting location at:

- 4 Complete and sign the form with an authorized facility administrator.



Both you and your facility's authorized administrator must sign the form for it to be used as ID.

- 5 Use the signed form as a temporary form of ID to vote during advance voting or on election day.
